Hi Everyone!!

Here's the June issue of the Club bulletin!! I hope you all enjoy the read. Well I would say Spring is here and we'll definitely see summer show up on June 21st just in time for Field Day. Hopefully we won't be playing around like the ducks do this year and have a nice sunny but breezy weekend at Purple Woods Conservation Area and a won-derful turnout by all. If you are interested in helping out with North Shore's Field Day setup please don't hesitate to give our trusty temporary leader Steve VA3TPS a call or drop him a line to express your interest in getting involved. The plan is to run 3A this year which means 3 transmitters running on generators the whole time.

Hopefully those who are interested in being a weather spotter for CANWARN were able to attend one of the training sessions listed in the April newsletter and had a really good time. I was able to attend along with a group of other North Shore ARC members at the CANWARN session held on Saturday May 4th at Environment Canada. If you didn't make it to that session maybe you attended the one on the Tuesday evening or another one of the sessions in the area. On the CANWARN note I have included an article that I found again on Twitter that ARRL Posted on the way HAM's played an active role after the EF5 tornado touched down in Moore Oklahoma. So far since the tornado season started there's been several in the United States and we have had a few touch down here in Ontario as well. As of May 24th the total number of confirmed tornados in Ontario was at 4. Here's where they have hit. On April 18th an EF1 tornado touched down in Shelburne ON. On Tuesday May 21st an EF2 tornado touched down in the small community of Cambray near Fenelon Falls. The last two tornados I have heard of confirmation for were both EFO tornados near the communities of Elmvale ON and Dalston ON. I also had the pleasure of talking to Mark Robinson from the Weather Network (aka the StormHunter guy) during the break that morning. He told me he was going to Tornado alley along with Jaclyn Whittal from the Weather Network and a few other meteorologists as well. They are on their way back north now I've been following them on the Weather Network and on Twitter and they are safe and heading back north. They were down in Oklahoma when Moore got hit.

Field Day is just around the corner and we will only be operating a 3A, but don't forget to drop by and say hello, and maybe grab a mic!




June meetings Guest Speaker

Summer Fun Events



This section will talk about all the club events happening between the end of June and the end of September. The Club does not hold monthly meetings during July and August so all the events are listed and described here for those two months as well as anything that happens after our June club meeting and the month of September. ARRL Field Day: Saturday June 22rd through to Sunday June 23th

Field Day is hosted by the ARRL down south and it is an emergency preparedness demonstration of amateur radio. Basically it's just as it sounds. You go out into a field, setup your radio station, power source, and antenna and try to make as many contacts as possible from 1400hrs Eastern time on Saturday June 22rd nonstop till 1400hrs Eastern time on Sunday June 23rd. We, the North Shore Amateur Radio Club, are going to be doing just that at Purple Woods Conservation Area running as 3A which means 3 transmitters running on a generator that weekend. Setup for our display is going to start on Friday, time will be announced at the club meeting, and we will begin operating at 1400hrs on Saturday June 22nd and going nonstop till 1400hrs on Sunday June 23rd. If you are interested in helping the club out by logging, operating, setup, teardown, doing PR work for our special dignitaries, or anything else please contact Steve McEdwards **VA3TPS** and he will gladly add your name to the list for that weekend.

Ride 4 United Way: Sunday August 25th

The Ride 4 United Way is just as it sounds. A bike ride starting at the Garnett B Rickard Complex in Bowmanville Ontario and ending at the Rickard complex as well. It's a whole day event and depending on where you get located as your checkpoint will determine if you are done at your checkpoint early in the day or later in the day. For this event all you need is yourself, a handheld radio at a minimum that can hit the VE3OSH repeater, a lawn chair possibly, and anything else you may want to bring along such as snacks, water, PowerAde, etc. If you happen to own a mobile rig that can be plugged into a cigarette outlet and a magmount external antenna bring that along too because there's always a minimum of 4 to 6 vehicles that we are situated in to go out onto the course as well. The courses consist of several different lengths which means there's a lot of checkpoints out on the course as well. If you are interested in helping out with this event, a minimum of 15 to 20 volunteers is needed for this event, please don't hesitate to get a hold of Larry Goucher **VA3FHG** and let him know your interested.

Pauls Dirty Enduro: Saturday September 21st, 2013

Pauls Dirty Enduro is the last event of the summer you could say. This event is another all day event out in the Ganaraska Forest providing communications, using a cross band repeater, throughout the entire forest. Pauls Dirty Enduro is a mountain bike race raising money for the Canadian Mental Health Association. Paul, who the race is named after, committed suicide in the forest and as a tribute to him and to help raise money for mental illness his friends started this race to raise money in his memory. For this event once again all you need as a minimum is a handheld with an antenna. If you have a mobile rig that can be plugged into a cigarette outlet and a magmount external antenna bring that along. It could be used in one of the mobile trucks that goes out in the forest as well to keep the different checkpoints stocked up with food and water and bring back DNF riders. In past years the group who participated in this event would meet up at the 5th Wheel Truck Stop in Bowmanville for breakfast and the pre-event meeting and then head out to the forest center and their various checkpoints. This year we have a new organizer Joe Stratton **VE3VGJ** and as of this time I hadn't heard from him as to whether that is changing or not but once I know I'll include those details in the July or August issue of the club bulletin. If you are interested in joining the group who participates in this event, we need a good number of volunteers I can't remember exactly how many from last year but I will put those details in later as well, don't hesitate to get a hold of **Joe VE3VGJ** and express your interest to him.


